
WIRRAMARRI Long Way from Home



Saturday 24 April, 5-7pm Koori's Beach, Narrandera

The historic fish kill event in Menindee on Barkindji Country in December 2018 and January 2019 saw an estimated one million dead fish in the Barka/Darling River. Staff from the Narrandera Fisheries Centre were immediately called to assist in the rescue effort. Their team rescued 20 Murray Cod, 24 Silver Perch and 17 Golden Perch to take back to Narrandera on Wiradjuri Country, in order for the fish to heal, and eventually breed.

Our two locations, Narrandera and Menindee, have been linked by this event. This projection and performance event is exploring how people from different cultural backgrounds can come together over serious national issues with reconciliation being at the forefront of their actions.

Art, science and ancient knowledges come together tonight through storytelling, projections and cultural dance.
